



To Our Alumni and the Greater Essex Catholic Community;

As you know, an important part of the Foundation's mission is to award scholarships to the descendants of Essex Catholic High School graduates.





aptain John Norman Reilly, Jr. '61 was a great, brave and heroic F4D Phantom pilot who flew close to 100 missions to support his fellow American soldiers in Vietnam. John faced MiG fighters, surface-to-air missiles and a combination of anti-aircraft artillery and automatic weapons. John received six commendations and is listed on the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial walls in Spring Lake, N.J., Holmdel, N.J. and Washington, D.C.

In 1957, Essex Catholic opened at 300 Broadway in Newark, with John enrolled in the first freshman class. In 1961, he graduated from Essex Catholic as a member of the first class



to attend the school all four years. John continued his education at St. Bonaventure University, graduating in 1965.After graduating from St. Bonaventure, John decided to become a pilot in the U.S. Air Force and enlisted on May 17, 1966. He had asthma and had his doctor help him get into the Air Force.

On December 26, 1966, John was home on Christmas leave and met

Elaine Mackin of Rutherford, N.J. on a blind date at the Holiday Festival in Madison Square Garden, where St. Bonaventure was playing. John proposed to Elaine five days later; they were married on July 2, 1967 at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Rutherford.

After many months of training to be a fighter pilot, on April 5, 1968, John left for Da Nang, Vietnam, leaving behind his expecting Elaine. John was stationed with the 390th Tactical Fighter Squadron, flying the F4D Phantom jet. He would fly close to 100 missions over North Vietnam in the next eight months, an average of 12 missions per month/three per week. Pilots who flew 100 missions over the "North" were allowed to go home. While in Vietnam, Elaine sent him medication so that he could fly. If John had gone to the flight surgeon and had his asthma discovered, he would have been grounded.

On October 13, 1968, Elaine gave birth to their son, Brian Thomas. John was notified and was delighted to have a son and to see a few pictures of Brian.

On November 19, 1968, 53 years ago today, Elaine was notified by the Air Force that John's F4D Phantom jet had apparently been shot down on his final approach to a landing strip in Da Nang after completing a mission over North Vietnam. He had volunteered for that flight. On December 13, 1968, John's remains were recovered, and Elaine was notified that his status was changed from MIA to KIA. He was 25 years old.

John was promoted to the rank of Captain posthumously. A funeral Mass was held on December 23, 1968 at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in East Rutherford, N.J. A busload of Essex Catholic alumni, faculty and students went to the church to honor John.

John was one of the first Essexmen to die for his country. May he rest in peace.






ichael P. "Pat" McStay '68 was born into an Irish family in the soccer town of Kearny, N.J. As a youth, he played soccer, basketball and baseball but soccer was his true passion. After graduating from St Cecilia's Grammar School, Pat decided to pursue his high school education at prestigious Essex Catholic. At Essex, Pat ran track his first two years, but continued to play soccer with the Scots Americans Club in Kearny. At the Scots Americans, Pat was coached by John Armitt, who he regarded as his greatest mentor and influence in soccer.

During his sophomore year, Pat met Brother Marty Germain, who shared his passion for soccer. Pat was a driving force along with a few other students, in helping Brother Germain start the Essex Catholic Soccer team. Pat played soccer his junior and senior years, providing a foundation for an elite group of underclassmen that went on to win back-to-back state championships in 1968 and 1969.

After graduating from Essex Catholic, Pat continued his playing career at a high level at Jersey City State and Farleigh Dickinson Universities, graduating from Farleigh Dickinson with a degree in Business. While Pat had a very successful career and aptitude for business, his love of soccer and teaching brought him back to Essex in 1974 to begin his lifelong career as a teacher and coach. The 1974 Eagles were the first team to beat Kearny,



Harrison and St. Cecilia's in a single season, and reached the State Semifinals. Pat is the second-winningest soccer coach in Essex Catholic history. He developed many players who became All-State, All-County and All-City selections.

After leaving Essex, Pat moved to the Jersey Shore, where he coached and organized soccer activities for high school and youth soccer

players. Throughout his extensive teaching career, he taught at Neptune High School in New Jersey, East Bay and Tallwood High Schools in Florida, and Granby High School in Virginia, while continuing his soccer career. He taught many students not only academics but influenced their approach towards life skills. He lived in the Tidewater area of Virginia, introducing and organizing soccer activities. He started clinics, camps and leagues all devoted to promoting soccer. Unfortunately, his devotion was cut short, as he passed away in 1999.

Pat's soccer resume includes a National A Coach License, a State Championship at Neptune H.S., college Coach at Old Dominion University, professional level coach with the Hampton Roads Piranhas, leading them to a National Championship appearance in the original Woman's League, Virginia ODP Coach, Director of Coaching at Norfolk United and Atlantic Soccer Clubs, and coaching at Tampa Bay Rowdies camps. Pat was also an event field producer when the U.S. hosted the 1994 World Cup in Orlando, saying that it was one of his greatest moments in soccer, and again at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta. He was inducted into the Granby and Neptune High School Hall of Fames, both in 2009.

Whether coaching or in a classroom, Pat was a natural teacher. He had the gift of understanding his students and players to help guide them. Pat was also a dedicated family man with "family" including a close circle of friends, many of whom are here to honor him tonight. Pat came from humble beginnings and valued time together with "family" more than material things or wealth. When you visited him, you could not leave without something; literally at times the shirt off his back.



ob Rapp '71, Harvard University and Case Western University Law School, was an excellent student/runner at Essex Catholic, very dependable and confident in coming to every race, ready to run his best. He had the same attitude in the classroom, where he graduated as one of the top students. Bob could run the 880, mile or two-mile and be competitive with the best runners in the New Jersey-New York area. His greatest race came at the outdoor 1971 Meet of Champions, where he ran 4:17.1 and won the race by three seconds. Among his outstanding races: 1970: Outdoor Parochial A Mile Champion, 4:24.0. 1971: Outdoor Parochial A Mile, 4:18.2 (tied with Tim Lee, who was declared the winner). 1971:



Outdoor Meet of Champions Mile Champion , 4:17.1. 1971: St. Joseph's Montvale 2 Mile Champion, 9:16. 1971: Half Mile, 1:54.

In addition to litigation, Bob's practice includes management training in the human resource field, design of personnel systems, preparation of policies and handbooks, drafting executive employment agreements, creation of affirmative action plans for government contractors, advice on reductions in force and other employment terminations, and investigations of alleged employee misconduct such as theft of trade secrets, sexual harassment and whistleblower claims, as well as for claims of unlawful discrimination.








alt Ricciardi '71, Columbia University, New York University School of Law, NYU Adjunct Professor of Law, was an excellent student athlete at Essex Catholic. He ran many miles over the summer of 1970 and came back to school as a Senior in September as the most

improved runner on the Eagles Cross Country team.

Walt had a very positive effect on the Varsity team as he was always someone you could count on to run at his best in each race. Walt carried over his improvement to the1971 indoor/outdoor seasons by being versatile in running 3:18 for the ³/₄-mile indoors on the State relay team, 9:40 for 2 miles and 10:15 in his first 3,000 meter steeplechase at the Catholic Conference Championship at Rutgers Stadium. Walt always had a smile on his face and a positive attitude that carried over to the other runners on the team. Walt's demeanor continued in the classroom, where he



graduated as one of the top students.

A Partner at Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton & Garrison LLP, Walt has extensive experience defending a broad variety of investigations conducted by the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission, the Public Company Accounting Oversight Board and other regulatory authorities. Additionally, he has conducted several internal investigations for

public companies and audit committees, including investigations related to allegations of accounting and financial fraud.

Prior to joining Paul, Weiss in June 2008, Walt was Deputy Director of the SEC's Division of Enforcement, where he supervised many of the Commission's most significant investigations related to financial fraud, insider trading, investment advisers and broker-dealers. Walt was appointed to run the SEC's Boston office, which was responsible for enforcement and examination programs for the New England region. He was appointed Deputy Director of the SEC's Division of Enforcement in October 2005, and his duties included managing the enforcement efforts of the Commission's eleven regional offices. Upon his departure from the SEC, the Commission's chairman stated that "Walter Ricciardi, as much as anyone in the Commission's modern history, has professionalized the management of the SEC's enforcementprogram." The Wall Street Journal reported that his departure from the SEC was a "blow to the enforcement program; he has won the affections of the staff and has boosted morale."

Prior to joining the SEC, Walt spent 20 years with PricewaterhouseCoopers and its predecessor, Coopers & Lybrand, where he was in charge of defending the firm's litigation and regulatory matters. While at PwC, he was elected by his partners to serve on the firm's board, which is responsible for overseeing its management. He was also elected by the partners to serve on the Global Oversight Board of the PwC global organization.

Walt lectures and writes extensively on securities litigation and regulatory issues. As an Adjunct Professor at New York University School of Law, he teaches a seminar on issues in SEC enforcement.








om Sharkey '71 is one of those Essexmen gifted with multiple talents—artistic, academic and athletic. At Essex, he was a National Honor Society, Student Council and YCS member. In the Essex Catholic Drama Club, he had leading roles as Tony in *West* Side Story, Billy Bigelow in Carousel and Sam in Wait Until Dark.

Tom applied his theatrical talents at Nutley Community Theater, where he was in the Chorus of *Guys and Dolls* and the stage crew. Musically, he was part of the Seber-Hauze-Sharkey Trio, and sang at Sunday folk masses in area parishes and in the Essex Chapel. Somehow, he found time for JV Fencing, Track and Field, Intramural Sports and the Pep Team.

Post-Essex Catholic, Bob coached boys baseball and soccer and girls softball, basketball and soccer. After relocating to the Washington D.C. region, he was a player/manager in the Ponce DeLeon Baseball League. His theatrical exploits continued at the



Little Theatre of Alexandria, where he repeated his Essex Catholic role as Billy in *Carousel* and played Rob in *Up the Down Staircase*. At the New Playwrights Theater in Washington, he played multiple parts in the *Dolly Baroque* musical. In Arlington at Community Theater, he was in the *Guys and Dolls* chorus, and provided theater tech support at Langley High School.

At Saint John the Baptist, Draper, Va., Bob was a Tiger, Wolf and Webelos Scouts parent, and a tenor in the choir at masses and ecumenical combined choir events. His rock band, Sharkey and the Hammerheads, has performed in charity events for the Knights of Columbus, Catholic Charities, Battle of the Law Firm Bands and Walter Reed Hospital. Since relocating to the Salt Lake City area, he continues sharing his talents with the Valuara Arnold Singers and Draper Arts Council.

Bob enjoyed a distinguished career in government. At the United States Postal Service Office of the Inspector General, he was Director of Strategic Planning and Performance, Principal Economist, Special Assistant to the Deputy Inspector General, and Executive Director of the IG Institute. At the GAO, he was Evaluator-in-Charge. Bob was also a Congressional Staffer on the House Government Reform and Oversight Committee. At USPS headquarters, he was Volume Statistics Branch Revenue Manager, Government Relations Manager, and Senior Economist.

An author of numerous scholarly papers, Bob was the recipient of USPS OIG General Excellence and Distinguished Achievement Awards; USPS Meritorious, Special Achievement and Legislative Reform Work Awards; and other awards from the National Honor Society, American Economics Association, American Society of Public Administration, Alpha Lambda and Phi Sigma Alpha.

Bob holds a Master of Public Administration, Concentration in Economics and Public Finance *Magna Cum Laude* from American University, Washington D.C.; a Graduate Certificate in Global Business Leadership from Georgetown School of Business; and a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science *Cum Laude* from Kean University.






herever Akbar Cook '94 goes, people recognize him. From *The Ellen DeGeneres Show*. From the time Oprah Winfrey visited his school. From the feature on *CBS This Morning*. He's known as the rock star principal of Newark West Side High School, the man inspiring

principal of Newark West Side High School, the man inspiring legions with his "crusader approach" to urban education. He's one of the best high school coaches in New Jersey.

Akbar has worked miracles at Newark's West Side High, a struggling school wedged in a dangerous section of the city marred by graffiti and gangs. And he also set the education world on fire—and caught the eyes of Ellen and Oprah—with a pair of initiatives credited with saving lives and spurring enrollment. The firs —"Lights On"—keeps the school open late on weekends and in the summer to give students a safe space to hang out, play games and eat free food. The other brought five washers and dry-



ers to West Side, so kids who were either homeless or didn't have clean clothes can do their laundry and avoid ridicule and embarrassment. He's piloted the boys' basketball team to back-to-back state championships—the first in the school's 91-year history. Those triumphs netted Cook, 43, State and County Coach of the Year honors, and built West Side into one of the state's

most feared programs.

Basketball always led the way, Akbar says. He picked up a ball in first grade "and that was it." He played nearly every day with his buddy, Rashaan Palmer '94, a future NCAA Division I star at St. Bonaventure ands fellow 2021 Hall of Famer, even when it was raining and snowing. He grew up with his mom and younger sister in a tough West Ward neighborhood filled with gangs, drugs and fighting. He barely knew his father. But Akbar loved to play basketball, and playing ball helped him steer clear of trouble. He starred at St. Anne Elementary School, then Essex Catholic. Then, after two years of junior college, he landed a Division I scholarship to Florida Atlantic.


Akbar is the newest member of the Essex Catholic High School Foundation Board of Trustees, and is committed to our organization and helping us reach out to 1990s graduates.






ashaan Palmer '94 is Essex Catholic's all-time leading basketball scorer, amassing 1,451 points playing varsity ball in his Sophomore, Junior and Senior years under head coach and Hall of Fame member Chuck Colaiacovo. "To know Essex Catholic is to love Essex Catholic" is his Talon yearbook epitaph. He describes his time at Essex as "a wonderful journey where I made lifelong friends and had amazing moments on the court."

Rashaan went on to play four years of NCAA Division I basketball at St. Bonaventure, in the Atlantic 10 Conference. He averaged 14.5 PPG. The *Olean Times Herald* in 2020 picked him as one of the four best St. Bonaventure players of the 1990s:

Palmer, quietly, was the most successful Bonnies player from a combined individual and team standpoint of the 1990s. The 6-5 forward still sits just outside the top 10 in program history in scoring (12th, 1,657 points), having averaged better than 16 points over his sophomore, junior and senior seasons. He was one of just two players to appear on both of the Bonnies' postsea-




son teams of the 1990s (alongside walk-on Jamie Moses), leading St. Bonaventure to the 1998 NIT with averages of 17.1 points and 5.1 rebounds per game. Palmer is one of just five players in St. Bonaventure annals to make three A-10 All-Conference teams (Moses, Marques Green, Andrew Nicholson and Jaylen Adams are the others), earning Third Team honors in each of the

1996, 1997 and 1998 seasons.

Rashaan went on to play professional basketball in Finland and the Dominican Republic, then returned to the U.S. to play in the ABA and UBA leagues.

For the past 13 years, Rashaan has dedicated himself to public service as a Newark, N.J. firefighter. He and wife Felicia have four children. He is a humble man, having accepted induction to the Essex Catholic Hall of Fame mostly because his lifelong friend, Eagles teammate and 1994 classmate Akbar Cook, is being inducted this year. Rashaan and Akbar, at 6-5 and 6-7 respectively, were known as the "Twin Towers" at Essex.






racy Mays '96 believes Essex Catholic, especially Brother James DePiro and his coaches, saved his life. Growing up in the Central Ward of Newark, he knew he didn't want to go to Central High School, feeling it was a dangerous place, and his family agreed. After briefly relocating to West Virginia—"I didn't like it at all. I used my allowance to buy a train ticket and came back," he recalls—Tracy contacted ECHS basketball coach Chuck Colaiacovo, who he knew from youth leagues, and arranged for an interview at Essex Catholic in East Orange.

Brother Thomas Leto, who was principal at the time, asked Tracy to sign a contract that he would maintain good grades in return for tuition support. "You are an investment," Brother Leto told him. He took two buses each way, leaving home before dawn and arriving back after dark, but most of his time was spent in the school. "Essex was great," Tracy says. "I worked out, cleaned the school, whatever they needed me to do."

Although he planned on playing basketball, when Essex Catholic great Larry Shumacher '66 became football coach, he



had other ideas for Tracy, who he knew from Pop Warner football in Newark. "You're going to be my quarterback," Shumacher said.

The combination of Shumacher and Mays turned around the fortunes of the Eagles, who were not known as a winning football program. "It started with me," Tracy says. "It's one of the things I hang my hat on." He credits Shumacher, assistant

coach Frank Stanco and Brother DePiro, who had become principal, with keeping him on the straight and narrow.

"I credit those three with saving my life," he said, relating how Brother DePiro knew immediately the one time he cut school and called his mother. Stanco, who mentored him and cooked for him, knew every place he might hang out, Tracy said, and Shumacher "scared the life out of me. That was his role."

Tracy, who was All-State in football in his senior year, played baseball all four years at Essex, starting as a catcher, and then an outfielder and pitcher, making All-State as a utility player and batting .500 his senior year. He also played football at Montclair State—at quarterback, flanker, and kick returner—earning a degree in sociology with a minor in criminal justice. He went on to get a master's in child advocacy from Montclair State and a master's in social work from Rutgers.

Tracy has worked for the state Division of Child Protection and Permanency for 20 years and currently is investigative supervisor of a multi-disciplinary forensic unit based in Newark, handling the most egregious child-protection cases in Essex County. A resident of Hillside, he has lectured at Rutgers-Newark and Essex County College and is an adjunct instructor at Montclair State.

Tracy's daughter, Kyasia, 20, is a pre-med student at Rutgers in New Brunswick. He also has a 13-year-old son, Joziah, a 2½-yearold daughter, Zhuri, and a 6-year-old soon-to-be stepdaughter, Zoey. He has coached his children in football and softball and is active in community service through his Masonic Lodge.

"That '96 group, we started some things," he says about his days at Essex Catholic. "But those classes behind me really kept things going."

The Essex Catholic Crest

The crest of Essex Catholic High School is rich in meaning and idealism. The overall shape of the shield is a buckler of faith, the Christian's defense against the arrows of temptation, and a sure protection against the wiles of

and a sure protection against the wiles of Satan in the strife of life's daily battle for salvation. The Strip d'Argent, on field azure, indicat-

The Strip d'Argent, on field azure, indicating the school colors (blue and silver), favorites of Our Lady, and the Fleur-di-Lis on the center strip, symbolic of the lily of purity, are from the crest of the Archbishop of Newark.

The Fleur-di-Lis also symbolizes the double unity of the Holy Trinity. The three petals on the heraldic design reflect the widespread association with the Holy Trinity, with the horizontal band symbolizing Mary. The tradition says that without Mary, you cannot understand the Trinity, since it was she who bore the Son.

The Crown and Sword at the upper left of the crest represent the patroness of the school, Our Lady of Sorrows, "whose own soul and sword hath pierced." The crown represents the crown of thorns Jesus wore at his crucifixion. The sword is symbolic of the sword that pierced Mary's heart as she watched Jesus die on the cross.

The intertwined XPM at the upper right, also known as the Chi-Rho Cross, repeats the goal of devotion to Our Lady set forth in the school's motto, "Ad Jesum per Mariam" (to Jesus through Mary). The letters X and P are often used as another symbol for "Christ." The first two letters

of Christ's name in Greek are X and P. In the Greek alphabet, X equals CH and P equals R. The letters are usually inscribed one over the other, sometimes enclosed within a circle, becoming both a cosmic and a solar symbol.

The two Stars symbolize the New Testament promise, "Those who instruct others unto justice shall shine as stars for all eternity." This promise is hope of the Christian Brothers of Ireland who taught in Essex Catholic High School and the hope of the boys who will instruct others by the example of their Christian lives. The stars also signify enlightenment, guidance, and instruction.


The Celtic Cross, a cross with Celtic rope work decoration, represents the beacon of faith and harmony of lives well spent for Christ. The traditional crest of the Christian Brothers of Ireland, it notes the origin of the order from the famed "Isle of Saints and Scholars."

Ad Jesum per Mariam, Latin for "To Jesus through Mary," the Essex Catholic motto. Mary leads us to Jesus, our Lord and Savior. This belief is taken from the first miracle of Jesus at Cana.

The date of Essex Catholic High School's founding, 1957, anchors our school's crest.
