To Our Alumni and the Greater Essex Catholic Community;

As you know, an important part of the Foundation's mission is to award scholarships to the descendants of Essex Catholic High School graduates.

In 2020, the Board of Trustees authorized creation of the *Century Club*, the intent of which is to have 100 Essex Catholic alumni donate a minimum of \$100 per year exclusively for scholarships, with the goal of raising at least \$10,000 annually. The total amount of scholarships awarded thus far, \$41,500 over the course of three years, would not have been possible without the generosity of those who supported our *Century Club*. This generosity has put meaning and substance into the Scholarship Fund, and we look forward to ongoing support of a minimum \$100 per year, which will continue to allow us to award meaningful scholarships on behalf of our beloved school.

t Essex Catholic, the late Dan Christy was on the honor roll and played on the golf teams all four years. When he was a sophomore and joined the new wrestling team, Dan helped to usher in the Gene D'Alessandro era. He stayed with golf and on the honor roll, but he made waves when he and other sophomores along with freshmen joined Coach D and Mr. Zarro on the first Essex Catholic wrestling team.

Dan was a "pinner." He led the team in pins in a season in 1963 and in dual meet pins in 1964. Recognizing their trailblazing status, Dan and all Juniors in 1963 (there weren't any seniors on the team) and all Seniors in 1964 were selected as team captains. Wrestling all three years at 130 pounds, he finished



15th on the all-time career-winning percentage list of Essex wrestlers who had more than 15 matches. At 21-7, Dan's percentage was .750. He was a leader on the Essex wrestling team and Coach D pointed out that Dan was a volunteer coach at Essex in 1965-1966, the season after he graduated. Dan didn't win any tournaments or District titles, but he led our team in pins in both his Junior

and Senior years and earned the honor of being a captain in both years.

Dan and two of his classmates continued wrestling at Catholic University on scholarships for wrestling. CU had a program that went back to 1950, and Dan wrestled on the freshman and varsity teams before he transferred to Rutgers Newark. He got his degree there and began teaching math, physic, and English in various high schools. After Dan decided to change fields, he got a second degree from NCE, now NJIT. At Rutgers Newark, Dan met his wife Dolores, to whom he was happily married until his death in 2006. He moved away from the New York Metropolitan Area in the 1970s and followed his career by engaging in bigger roles in the public hydrology field up and down the East Coast.

While attending engineering school, Dan began working for the Montclair Water Bureau and concentrated on public water systems for the rest of his professional career. He worked for and in one instance led departments in Montclair, Southington, Conn., West Nyack, N.Y., Pinellas County, Fla., and Frederick, Md. Dan maintained membership in American Water Works Association and related organizations in North Jersey, Connecticut, New England, Florida and the Chesapeake Bay. He participated in public relations and public service, giving tours to school groups, and updating the subterranean aqueduct system in New York City. Immediately before his death in 2006, Dan became the principal of Christy Consulting LLC of Odessa, Md.

Dan is loved and missed not only by his wife, Dolores but also by his sister, Barbara, sister-in-law Janet, brother-in-law Russ as well as his nieces and nephews (John, Toni, Beth, Jennine, Chris, and Jason), who wish he was here to talk them through life's sticky situations.

ike Flannery '68 grew up in Bloomfield and was fortunate enough to start and finish his high school career at Essex Catholic. There were many faculty members who had a profound impact on his choices and performance while at Essex. Brothers Jensen, Germain, Danker, Naclerio and Wright all inspired him to apply himself to his studies.

Mike played football under Mr. Greg Riel and was on the track and field team coached by Brother Anthony Naclerio for four years. As a football player, Mike played tackle and garnered recognition on the All-City teams. On the track and field team, Mike threw the shot put and discus. He was a member of the Essex Catholic team that set a national record for a four-member shot put relay team. He was named to several postseason All-City, All-County and All-Parochial teams. Brother Nick, who would go on to coach the United States Olympic field team, would later publish a book, "Progressions of the Shot Put and Discus," in which Mike is featured on several pages.



Mike entered the United States Military Academy in 1969. During his tenure at West Point, he played football for four years, lettering in his last two years. He was also involved in intramural wrestling and basketball. He persevered through the challenging academic rigors of the academy and its engineering program.

In 1973, Mike graduated from the oned as an infantry officer in the U.S.

West Point and was commissioned as an infantry officer in the U.S. Army. His duty stations were Fort Ord, Calif., Fort Hood, Tex.; Hohenfels, Germany; West Point; Fort Drum, N.Y., and California Polytechnic University. During his military career, Mike served as platoon leader, company executive officer, company commander, battalion operations and training officer, supply officer, executive officer in the Office of the Director of Intercollegiate Athletics at West Point, brigade personnel officer, emergency deployment readiness officer and professor of military science.


Mike retired from the Army in 1993 and followed his passion to teach. He served as a high school Junior ROTC instructor in Pomona, Calif. The students dealt with very challenging issues. Mike took pride in the growth of these students and how they thrived in the JROTC environment. Many went on to serve in the military, breaking the cycle of their home environment.

In 1999, Mike and his family moved to Virginia Beach, where he continued his passion for teaching, but this time as an elementary school health and PE teacher. He liked to run his PE classes as a mini-military training camp. The kids absolutely loved his PE classes. While teaching, Mike also volunteered in various activities, including teaching CCD classes, serving as the manager for his daughter's summer league swim team, and as the manager for his son's travel soccer team.

After years of teaching PE, in 2016, with much thought and consideration, he decided it was time to relax. Mike and his wife Mary are both happily retired. They live in Virginia Beach and love entertaining, traveling, exercising, attending Army football games and spending time with family and friends. They have four children and five grandchildren with whom they enjoy spending time any chance they get.

years and a member of the track and field team for four years. He was truly dedicated to field sports and his team. His personal best in the shot-put was 60 feet 1 inch, and his personal best in the discus was more than 150 feet, with warm-up throws of more

than 200 feet.

Keith was captain of the field team and a member of the shot-put relay team at the NJSIAA (New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association) meet in 1968, setting a record. The relay team included Mike Flannery'68 (inducted this year into the Essex Catholic Hall of Fame), Robert Gray '68, Ron Thau '69 and Keith. That shot-put relay meet record held for more than 20 years. Keith was also a member of the shot-put relay team that set the National High School Shot-Put Relay record in 1969. That record was then broken two years later by another Essex Catholic team consisting of Alan Wujciak '72, John McCree '71, Tom Flannery '72 and Rudy Guevara '71, all in the Hall of Fame.

Keith served in the U.S. Army from 1971 to 1984. When the Essex County courthouse was dedicated as "Veterans Courthouse," he was one of the veterans selected to appear and be honored. Keith served as Commander and Sergeant-at-Arms for his American Legion Dunellen Post 119.

Beginning in 1977, Keith made his career with the Office of the Essex County Register of Deeds and Mortgages. Recording documents manually and via computer input, serving as a vault clerk, researching and storing records, and performing map indexing were among his positions for 32 years. Upon his retirement, he was honored by The Essex County Board of Chosen Freeholders.

Keith is the proud father of Jonathan Walker Jarvis and grandfather to Marine Corps – E2 Jonathan Jarvis Junior and granddaughter Maya. He would like to thank his family for supporting him and sharing in this honor.



anny Sullivan '69's love of sports, faith and family have benefited each community touched by him, and it all began at Essex Catholic. While at Essex Danny was involved in a multitude of sports: football, swimming, wrestling, club boxing and ice hockey. He learned much from his coaches (Bob Taglieri, Brother Reddy, Gene D'Alessandro, Brother Valdez, and most important, his dad, Dan Sr., (ice hockey), and he took these lessons and spread them to others, starting as a student. After being elected Student Council president, Danny obtained support from faculty and students to start an ice hockey team. Brother Brennan agreed to be the faculty moderator, but the team still needed a coach. Danny recruited his father, who had played high school hockey for Framingham (Mass.) and college hockey for Holy Cross. The Sullivans, with some very talented Essex men, had a winning season that first year. This love of hockey stayed with him. In 2003, Danny was again recruited to help and coached Eastern High School, Voorhees, N.J., to a league championship.

When Seton Hall Prep expanded programs to include ice hockey, Athletic Director Father Michael Kelly recruited Danny to coach. Danny's brothers Patrick and Tommy played for the team and in their second season, Seton Hall Hockey won the High School Division Championship. Always ready for new

adventures, Danny played soccer for Mount St. Mary's College. He joined the Essex Rugby Club, and after moving to Marlton, N.J., joined the South Jersey Rugby Club, where he returned to coaching, even taking the team on a tour of England and Wales. He also played for the Scarlet Old Boys at Rutgers University. Danny continued to play Old Boys' Rugby, including the 2005 Golden Oldies Rugby Tournament to San Diego with the Philadelphia MARS (Middle Aged Rugby Side) Team. Danny expanded his athletic repertoire by officiating high school and youth sports, including ice hockey, wrestling and soccer. He founded and coached the Marlton side for the South Jersey Soccer League for a team that included girls, one of whom was his daughter Kelly



ark Cavanaugh '72, Ph.D., enterd Essex Catholic after graduating from Sacred Heart School in the Vailsburg section of Newark. During one of his first days at Essex Catholic, he was attracted to the noise in the auditorium and discovered that the stage crew was preparing for the yearly musical under the direction of Br. Rich Gray. For four years he worked with the stage crew but also acted. He was in "Inherit the Wind," played Doc in "West Side Story," starred as Oscar Madison in "The Odd Couple" and as murderous Harry Roat, Jr. in "Wait Until Dark," and had three



separate roles in the production of "Carousel." In senior year, he played Horace Vandergelder in "Hello Dolly."

Mark was an integral member of the Essex Catholic Forensics Team for three years. In his senior year, he participated in the final round of the National Catholic Forensics Tournament in New Orleans. Mark's athletic service

consisted of varsity basketball team manager under Hoddy Mahon, and football team manager under Coach Bob Taglieri during the famed 1971 11-0-1 season. He was a frequent supporter of all sports, even visiting athletes whose injuries put them in the hospital. The name "Mark Cavanaugh" was on bylines for *The Eagle*, and he contributed to the annual yearbook, *The Talon*. Because of his extensive academic, extra-curricular and service accomplishments, Essex Catholic awarded him its most prestigious honor at commencement in 1972, Foremost Essex Senior.

The "Vailsburg Cavanaughs" contributed greatly to Essex Catholic. All four "Cavanaugh Boys"—Larry, Jim, Tim and Mark—are Essex alumni. Jim is often featured on cable news stations following mass shooting incidents, as he is a former USATF Special Agent in Charge.

Mark has been an Associate Professor in the Department of Conflict Resolution at Nova Southeastern University in Fort Lauderdale since 1988. He holds a Bachelors degree in English from Iona College, and Masters and Doctoral degrees from the University of Notre Dame. He has taught a wide variety of courses at "Nova" since its inception. Mark served as the NAIA/NCAA Faculty Athletics Representative for 23 years and shepherded the university's membership into the NCAA starting in 1997.

Mark is also a musician who has conducted orchestras in the United States and Europe, and composed music and lyrics for the "NSU Alma Mater" and its "Victory March." Currently, he is working on a book that lays out the underlying neuroscience of music and conducting in Western classical music. He lives in Plantation, Fla.

bility and good sportsmanship are two qualities that exemplify a talented athlete, and Paul Martino '72 had no difficulty mastering this in his fencing career. He picked up fencing as a freshman at Essex, but was cut from the team. However, later that year he decided to show up at practice and earned a spot on the team. By the end of his freshman year, he came in first place in a competition among his peers. By the time he reached his senior year, he earned being named foil



team captain, as well as overall team captain, helping to bring the team to a State Championship in1972. He was also awarded the honor of First team All-State.

Paul continued his education and fencing career at William Paterson College and in 1974 won the Under 20 National Championship. He then represented the United States at the Junior World Championships in

Istanbul, Turkey. In 1975, he went undefeated 42-0 while fencing against some of the nation's top teams such as Notre Dame, Maryland, Penn State and North Carolina. He went on to win The National Junior Championship and represented the United States at the Junior World Championships in Mexico City.

Paul was named NCAA First Team All American in 1976. In recognition of his skill and overall sportsmanship on the fencing strip, he was named Outstanding Foil Fencer of the Year by NCAA opposing fencers and coaches nationwide. In 1983, he was inducted into the William Patterson College Hall of Fame for his contributions to the sport.

After graduating from college in 1977, Paul he was invited to join The New York Athletic Club. As an athletic member of this prestigious club, he was a part of a four-man foil team that won the Men's National Championship. He then spent eight years at CF Air freight starting as a sales representative and worked his way up to Manager of National Accounts of the Government Aerospace Division.

Paul married Linda in 1984. In 1986 they opened their first successful beauty supply store together and had multiple retail salon stores that operated for more than 35 years. Within those years they were blessed with their daughter Jenna in 1988. Jenna married Cameron DiFede in 2019, then in July 2022 Paul and Linda were blessed again with their granddaughter Drue Nicole. Their daughter Jenna followed in her father's footsteps by becoming a top athlete, but in the sport of lacrosse, both in high school and college. In 2009, she earned First Team Regional All-American honors and in 2022 had the honor of being inducted into her alma mater Hall of Fame at St Joseph's University, Philadelphia.

he late Carlos Bazo '73 was born in Cuba and escaped to Florida with his family before set-tling in the Vailsburg section of Newark. Carlos had a great positive demeanor, always smiling with the will to win. He was an excellent runner from the start of his freshman year at Essex Catholic, winning several races. He improved during his sophomore year as he ran the mile in 4:19.8 and the two-mile in 9:13.2 to win the outdoor Parochial A Championship.

During his junior year, Carlos led a 1,2,3 finish at the Parochial A Cross Country Championship by winning the race in 12:29.2 followed by Chris Inman and Steve Liquori. During the indoor season, Carlos won the indoor Parochial A Championship two-mile in 9:27.9. He finished off the indoor season as the best two-miler in New Jersey by winning the Meet of Champions two-mile in 9:11.0 at Princeton University. Carlos continued his great running outdoors by winning the Parochial A Championship two-mile in 9:13.2 and anchoring the distance medley teams to first place at the East Coast Relays and the New York Relays with a 4:12.5 mile as the team won in a time of 10:08.4.

The New York Times wrote an article about the race on May



7, 1972: "Essex Catholic, on the strength of a gutsy mile anchor leg by Carlos Bazo, beat St. Joseph's by two yards in the good time of 10 minutes 8.4 seconds. The Buffalo school had won this event in the Queens-Iona meet and last week at the Penn Relays missed the national record by less than a second. Essex Catholic took the lead on the 440 leg, but Eric Trammell ran a fine

1:54.4 half-mile to put St. Joseph's on top by three yards going into the anchor mile. Gary Duszynski, who won the indi-vidual mile, did a commendable job in holding off Bazo until the last lap. Bazo made a move early in the backstretch and Duszynski fought him off. But the Essex Catholic junior was not to be denied. He switched his baton from the left to the right hand, put his head down and start-ed to sprint as the two reached the final turn. When they came off the turn, Bazo was in the lead and he hit the tape two yards in front. His time of 4:12.5 for the mile was his fastest by almost seven seconds."

During his senior year, Carlos was ineligible to run because he started school late when he came to the U.S. Still, he received a full track scholarship to Eastern Michigan University.
