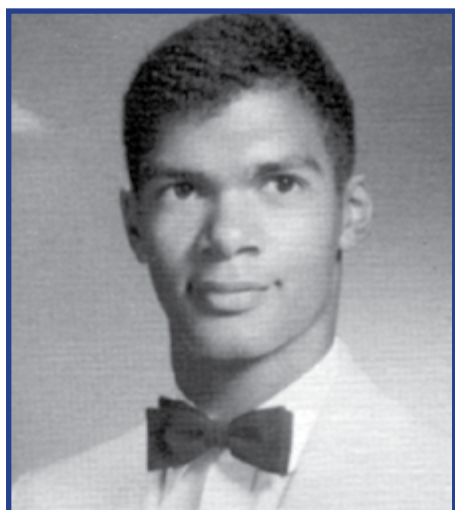

To Our Alumni and the Greater Essex Catholic Community;

As you know, an important part of the Foundation's mission is to award scholarships to the descendants of Essex Catholic High School graduates.

In 2020, the Board of Trustees authorized creation of the *Century Club*, the intent of which is to have 100 Essex Catholic alumni donate a minimum of \$100 per year exclusively for scholarships, with the goal of raising at least \$10,000 annually. 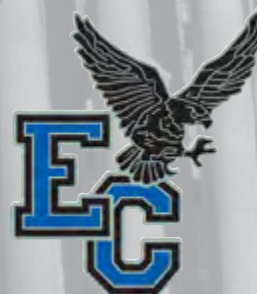

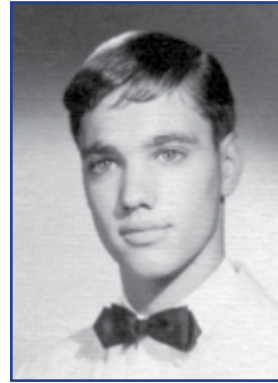

Naval officer and took on double duty flying and tending to medical needs.

From there a remarkable service career unfolded. Driven by his dedication and leadership ability, Dr. Yacavone became a Naval flight surgeon pilot. His skill, compassion and competence were fully recognized, and the Navy sent him to Harvard University for advanced training. He received a master's degree in public health.

On his return, Dr. Yacavone was stationed in Norfolk, home of the Sixth Fleet, and he worked his way up to chief medical officer (SMO) of the nuclear aircraft carrier USS Eisenhower, "The Ike." During his commission on The Ike, he modernized the hospital system and made it suitable for women military personnel. He was instrumental in enabling the first deployment of a Naval ship with women.

Dr. Yacavone sailed with The Ike in combat during the first Gulf War. On his return from the Gulf, he trained in special counter-terrorist operations and returned to The Ike. There he continued his innovative work in Naval hospital design and patient care.

The next step in David's career was to help design and modernize the Navy's next generation of the Nimitz class carrier, the USS Harry S. Truman. Dr. Yacavone left an indelible mark on Naval flight medicine, having chaired key initiatives in his career, including introduction of women onto Naval ships and the modernization of afloat hospitals. Throughout his stellar career he was recognized several times, including being awarded the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal, Armed Forces Service Medal, NATO Medal, Kuwait Liberation Medal and Counter Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, among many others.

Dr. Yacavone was a true Renaissance Man. Besides all his achievements, he enjoyed and supported the arts. He loved musical theater and during his retirement he served as a member on the board of the Virginia Opera.

After Dr. Yacavone's retirement from the Navy, he again worked in clinics and emergency rooms serving those most in need. This life well-lived was slowed by various health issues and cancer. Dr. Yacavone outlived his wife Nancy by eight months. He is survived by his children, Chris, Rebecca, Jason and Briana, and three grandchildren, Hannah, Noah and Sarah. He was laid to rest with full military honors in Norfolk in March 2019.

**D**avid William Yacavone '63 lived an exemplary life of service he often attributed to his Essex Catholic education, providing him with a moral compass and leadership skills. David grew up in Bloomfield, N.J. with his parents and two younger sisters, Tina and Carol. He attended St. Francis Xavier Elementary School before Essex Catholic. Life dealt him some challenges, as he lost his beloved mom during his senior year.

David graduated ECHS in 1963, completed his bachelor's degree at Seton Hall in three years and went on to post-graduate work in Asian Studies. His first position was civil rights investigator in Newark, where he tirelessly sought to bring justice to the marginalized. Through this time, David's love of helping people drew him to medicine, and he finished his medical degree at Missouri Osteopathy College. After medical school he worked in clinics and emergency rooms in Chicago, Lansing and Jacksonville. During his time in Jacksonville, he was introduced to the need for medical care at the local Navy air base. This led to his next adventure: learning to fly. He was commissioned as a

in the two-mile run. In outdoor track, he won the Essex County Championship two-mile race, and the team came in first place. He also won the individual Parochial A State Championship in the two-mile.

"Essex Catholic had a great reputation for cross-country and track and field, especially for runners and throwers," Matt says. "To be a part of that history gave me a sense of

pride and responsibility to continue this well-earned reputation."

After Essex Catholic it was off to Penn State University on a partial scholarship. "When I arrived at PSU, we had a lot of state champions on the team from various states," Matt recalls. "I was shocked at how many of them didn't know how to train or to race. The background I had at Essex made the difference. It was coaching and it was having some very talented, hard-working teammates that allowed me to have success in high school and college. I had such respect for the state champions and national record setters on our teams at Essex that I didn't even speak to them unless they spoke to me first. Whatever they did at practice I tried to emulate. I always believed that, with the coaching and teammates I had at Essex and at Penn State, I had just jumped into a river with a strong current, and all I had to do was go with the flow."

At Penn State, Matt made the All-East Teams a couple of times and qualified for the Olympic Trials in the 10,000 meters. After graduation, he taught and coached at the Bellefonte Area School District, Pennsylvania. He was able to start the first girls cross-country and track and field teams and coach some very talented athletes while at Bellefonte High School.

"At Essex, there were many important persons for me among the faculty," Matt says. "Two had the name 'Dwyer': Coach Fred Dwyer and Brother Donald P. Dwyer. Coach Fred made me a champion. Bro. Dwyer coached me in my spiritual life and eventually helped me decide to become a religious priest as a Friar Minor Conventual. There isn't a day goes by that I don't think about the teachers, coaches, classmates and teammates I had at St. Peter's, Essex Catholic and Penn State. I am now a retired priest, but I never retire from praying for family and friends."

**A**fter graduating from St. Peter's Elementary School in Belleville, Fr. Matthew Chadwick '68 arrived at Essex Catholic High School in the Fall of 1964. He wanted a good Catholic education and to be an athlete. Matt was in the Glee Club, which presented a great Spring Concert, for a year. He was on the Honor Roll a few times and wrote for the *Eagle* newspaper and *Talon* yearbook. He also played intramural softball and bowling.

In his Sophomore Year, Matt went out for the cross-country team. The highlights of his Senior year were the team winning the Hudson County X-C Championship, the Roselle Catholic Turkey Trot, second place in the Eastern Championships and first in the State Parochial A Championships, the fifth in a row. Matt and teammate Tom Legge were voted the two most improved runners of the year in the Catholic Conference. In the Indoor State Championships, Matt finished second behind teammate Mike Keough

School in North Caldwell. Virtually his entire career in education, 32 years, was spent as a fifth and sixth grade teacher and administrator in North Caldwell.

Jack was fortunate to have had many opportunities to work with various age levels in sports. He became an assistant baseball coach at Immaculate in 1973 and worked with Joe Lennon at ICHS for five years. Jack was named head coach for the

James Caldwell American Legion Post

#185 baseball team in 1977, and, along with his deceased brother James (Dip), coached Caldwell to consecutive New Jersey State Championships in 1977 and 1978. Post #185 won the Mideast Regionals in 1978 and then moved on to the 1978 American Legion World Series in Yakima, Washington, where Caldwell concluded its remarkable season by going 2-2.

Jack was a registered basketball official for more than 30 years. He is still an active member, after 49 years, with the New Jersey State Baseball Umpires' Association. Since 1983, he has been an NJSBUA Board of Directors member and was chapter rules interpreter and trainer of prospective umpires for 32 years. He was a recipient of NJSBUA's Hall of Fame Award in 1997. Jack served as Co-Director of the Essex County Boys' Soccer Tournament (12 years) and as both Director of the Boys' Basketball ECT and the Greater Newark Baseball Tournament (GNT) for 25 years. From 2013-2023, Jack was an assignor of umpires for the NJSIAA state tournament and a member of the state tournament baseball committee. Jack was appointed NJSIAA Umpire Mechanics Chairperson in 2015 and held that position until the COVID pandemic. In 2002, Jack was named New Jersey Baseball Umpire of the Year by the National Federation of High Schools (NFHS) and was honored to have received an award from the New Jersey Scholastic Baseball Coaches' Association in 2013.

A devout Catholic, Jack has been attending daily Mass for more than 30 years. He has served as a Eucharistic Minister since 1992 and is still an altar server/acolyte. Jack is a very active 3rd Degree member and 4th Degree officer with the Knights of Columbus. He is a staunch advocate for "Protecting the Lives of the Unborn."

Jack has been blessed with a lovely wife, Helen, who is a retired physical education teacher, and a wonderful daughter, Katie, who works as a project manager for a small company in Fairfield. Jack and Helen reside at the Jersey Shore in Ventnor City.

Jack Venezia '68's decision to enroll at Essex Catholic in 1964 did not come easily. His closest friends were all going to Montclair Immaculate High School, only two short blocks from his home. There was a huge obstacle to overcome.

When Jack apprised his parents of his decision, they informed him that they would not be able to afford tuition for both his brother, Robert '67, and him. Jack recalled vividly praying for the Lord's guidance. His prayers were answered when, in a meeting with Jack's parents and priests at Immaculate to discuss the situation, the priests devised a proposal. In exchange for his father's work at Friday Night Bingo, Jack's tuition would be covered.

While at Essex, Jack made the Honor Roll in each of his four years, and he lettered as a varsity baseball player in 1967 and 1968. His overall record as pitcher was 6-1, and his most noteworthy wins were against Clifford Scott (then coached by Fred Hill) and St. Joe's Montvale in the state tournament. He was proud to have played with great teammates and coaches, and especially for Mr. Garvey.

After graduating Essex, Jack matriculated at Montclair State as an "Early Acceptance" student and was awarded a four-year state scholarship. Jack was a Dean's List student for four semesters and played on the MSU baseball team with his friend and former Eagle teammate, Kevin Cooney, from 1968-1972.

He finished with an 8-1 record as a Senior pitcher in 1975 and helped that team earn the only Greater Newark Tournament championship in school history, pitching a complete game against #1 Irvington in the GNT final. The 1975 baseball team finished 26-8 (a school record for most wins) and was ranked #3 in the final Star-Ledger Top 20 poll.

The 1975 team was inducted into the

Essex Catholic High School Hall of Fame in 2005.

After a successful high school career, John pitched for Upsala College. He broke the school record for career wins, finishing 29-7. As a Freshman, he pitched a one-hit shutout in his first collegiate start vs. Rutgers-Newark and had an 8-1 record, earning First Team All-Conference honors. John was named to the New Jersey College Baseball All-Star team three times and helped Upsala reach the College World Series in 1976, 1978 and 1979. He was a tri-captain in 1979, finishing 8-0 with the fifth-lowest ERA in the NCAA Division III ranks at 1.40.

John started coaching baseball in 1980 as an assistant at Nutley High School. He then went back to Essex Catholic and coached the Eagles from 1981-1986. His 1982 team won the Parochial A North Championship. John returned to Upsala as an assistant coach from 1986-1991. He also coached the Newark American Legion team, and managed teams in the Essex County Baseball League. He most enjoyed coaching his two sons in the Union Little League and Union AAU program. As a senior in 1976, Bruno led the Eagles to a Parochial A State Championship, garnering Star Ledger First Team All-City, First Team All-County, First Team All-State Parochial

“A” and First Team All-State honors as a second baseman. Amazingly, Bruno committed just one fielding error across his Junior and Senior seasons.

Coming out of Essex Catholic, Bruno was a highly regarded college prospect. He turned down numerous Division I offers to play at Division III powerhouse Upsala College. He was a four-year starter and was named captain for his Senior season in 1980. During his career at Upsala, Bruno’s teams made three consecutive NCAA Regionals and one trip to the Finals in Marietta, Ohio in 1980. He helped lead Upsala to the Division III College World Series in 1978, 1979 and 1980. After his Junior season, he played with the Chatham A’s in the prestigious Cape Cod League, where he roomed with future Major Leaguer Scott Bradley. Bruno was named a Division III First Team All-American as a Senior after batting an incredible .506. He amassed 238 career hits, including 83 in 1980, and 57 career doubles. He was an honorable mention selection at second base for The Star-Ledger All Century Team. After graduating from Upsala, Bruno played professionally in Italy. Major League player Rick Cerone ’72 was a valued mentor of Bruno’s throughout his baseball career and beyond. In 2010, Bruno was inducted into the Newark Athletic Hall of Fame.

Bruno lives in Butler with Tricia, his wife of 29 years. They are the proud parents of two daughters, Daniella and Adrianna. Bruno volunteered many hours in the Butler Township youth soccer and basketball programs when the girls were growing up. He also was an assistant baseball coach with Essex Catholic and the Newark American Legion in the early 1980s.

**B**runo Giordano '76 was born and raised in Newark's North Ward. He attended Sacred Heart Cathedral Grammar School. Following graduation from Essex Catholic, he went on to attend Upsala College and earned a B.A. in Business Management in 1980. # *Greg Reil, Teacher/Coach*



**G**reg Reil began his distinguished career at Essex Catholic in the Fall of 1961 as a history teacher, guidance counselor and football coach. He built the football program from the ground up, leading the team to a state championship in 1964. Yet his greatest legacy lies not in wins, but in the countless young men whose lives he shaped as a mentor, coach and counselor.

Born in Boston Oct. 2, 1926, Greg was the son of a Filipino WWI veteran and an Irish-American nurse. He was raised in Queens N.Y., and attended Iona Prep, excelling in football, baseball, track, basketball and fencing—winning a NYC fencing championship.

At only 17, Greg followed his siblings into service and enlisted in the U.S. Army during World War II. Serving in Italy, France and Germany, he rose to Sergeant, fought in the Battle of the Bulge, and helped liberate POW and concentration camps. He was a quintessential example of the fabled Greatest Generation.

It was the lessons of teamwork, brotherhood and leadership

Greg experienced on the battlefield that he brought to the playing field. The qualities of courage he witnessed at such a young age shaped him and imparted lessons he carried with him for the rest of his life. Of that time, he said, “I saw guys who didn’t make it to their 19th birthday. Every day after that is a gift.” His early experiences at war gave him mental, physical and spiritual toughness that served him for the rest of his life. He also cherished that precious gift of life—and always working hard, he enjoyed every minute of it.

After the war, Greg attended St. Bonaventure College, playing football under Coach Hugh Devore and alongside future NFL coach Ted Marchibroda. Known for his toughness and talent, he was Marchibroda’s favorite target and a feared defensive back. After a 1951 game against Louisville, Johnny Unitas recalled, “He was the hardest hitter I ever played against.” Greg also earned an invitation to the New York Yankees spring training camp. Later in life, he became a teaching tennis pro and served as a line judge at the U.S. Open.

Greg met his wife, Joyce, at St. Bonaventure, and together they raised four children. Many of his players recall Sunday dinners at the Reil home, followed by game film and life lessons. In summers, Greg managed a beach club at the Jersey Shore, giving jobs and guidance to many of his athletes.

Greg Reil was more than a coach. He was a father figure and a trusted advisor known for his strength, passion, humor and unwavering support. As a guidance counselor, he opened doors for students who never imagined college in their future, walking them through applications, finances, logistics and possibilities beyond their circumstances.

Greg Reil’s life embodied the values of courage, service and integrity. From the battlefields to the playing fields of Essex Catholic, he was a lion among men, living with purpose and giving selflessly to others.

The Foundation is pleased to introduce a new annual award named in honor of Anthony “Brother Nick” Naclerio, who established the Hall of Fame and Alumni Dinner in 1981. The inaugural *Anthony Naclerio Award for Foundation Support* goes to Gilbert H. Lamphere, a long-time colleague of Foundation Trustee Bill Vantuono ’77, Editor-in-Chief of rail industry trade publication *Railway Age*.

Gil has decades of experience as a principal investor and financier in railroad industry and other private equity transactions. He has extensive operational experience as a chairman and/or board member for a wide range of publicly traded and private companies. Gil is Chairman of MidRail Corp. and founder of MidSouth Rail Corp. He has been a Norfolk Southern (NS) Independent Director since 2024. In July of this year, NS and Union Pacific (UP) announced their intent to merge—a transaction that, if approved by the U.S.

Surface Transportation Board, would create the nation’s first coast-to-coast transcontinental railroad, with reach into Canada and Mexico.

Gil led management teams and boards that bought, managed and improved operations at Illinois Central (IC, where he served as Chairman from 1990 to 1998), MidSouth, CN (Canadian National), Florida East Coast (FEC) and Southern Pacific, with alumni leading Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR), creating gains for investors in excess of \$2 billion. While he was a director at CN and FEC, operating executives from senior leadership teams at IC and MidSouth were instrumental in improving operations and optimizing both companies. In addition, members of the team were also successful in turning around Southern Pacific (prior to its merger with UP) and CPR, now Canadian Pacific Kansas City following its 2023 merger with Kansas City Southern to form North America’s first and only single-line transnational (Canada-U.S.-Mexico) railroad. Gil has also served as a director of CSX and Patriot Rail.

Prior to his career in railroading, Gil led four successive, operationally focused private equity firms, and was Vice President of Mergers & Acquisitions at Morgan Stanley from 1976 to 1981.

Gil graduated from Princeton University with an A.B. in Economics with Honors and from Harvard Business School as a Baker Scholar and a recipient of the Loeb Rhoades Fellow finance prize.
